Message from Mrs McGonigle and Mr Fry

Dear Parents and Carers,

Middleton has a Deaf Hub provision. Ever since Rose Ayling-Ellis became the first deaf contestant to compete in Strictly Come Dancing, the number of people wanting to learn British Sign Language (BSL) has surged. One half of the overall winning couple, Rose was frequently seen using sign language on the show and she used a translator to interpret what others were saying. Things to talk about at home... Have you ever seen sign language being used or used it yourself? Can you make a list of all the different ways we communicate with each other? E.g. our body language, words, actions etc. Do you think sign language is a skill that everyone should do? We celebrate diversity in all our children and families.

Even if your child struggles with reading, it is so valuable for them to share a book read by you. Parents who read with their children and share books from a young age make a huge difference to their child's future reading development. It creates a love for books. It would be great if you supported us at home with their reading and shared a book with your child on a daily basis. Please speak to your child's class teacher about borrowing some of our fabulous books.

We like to advertise and celebrate businesses and charities within our local area and community. It is wonderful that the parents/carers at Middleton School have so much to offer. Please get in touch if you wish to share your business.

It is vitally important that when emailing and leaving answer phone messages that you let us know what is wrong with your children. If you do not provide this information the admin team will have to ring you to find out. The DfE absence coding for absences is complex because of Covid and regularly changes. This data is then used by the LA, DfE and Government to build local area information of need and supports decision-making. As a school we are therefore legally required to ensure we code children into our system accurately. Medication

This system occurs successfully in other schools and does not expect parents to 'drop everything' to come into school if our qualified First Aiders have assessed them.

Year 3 – SFA and Maths




In Miss Want's SFA group we have been reading classic fairy tales this week. We have looked closely at Little Red Riding Hood and Snow White.



We have been learning about the features of fairy tales to help us identify them.

In Miss Thompson's SFA group we have been reading I wonder why stars twinkle. We have found out lots of information about the Sun, Moon and planets in our Solar System.





In Maths, we have been using our knowledge of money to calculate the change required.


Year 3 - Science

We researched then labelled the parts of a human ear.

This week we have been learning about sound.

We experimented with different instruments to test how you can change the pitch.









We discovered that rice on a drum bounced when the drum was played. It jumped higher when the drum was hit harder because of the vibrations on the drum skin.



We made string telephones as part of our learning about how sound travels.

Science Week – EYFS & Lower School



In EYFS we have been exploring ice, making windsocks and playing with bubbles as part of our Winter Wonderland topic.







Year 1 have been learning all about animals.
We learnt a song called 'Fins, Gills and Tails' and sang this in the hall together.
We made our own 'stone pets', learning all about what makes a living thing and if adding features such as eyes, a mouth and arms would make a stone a living thing.







Year 2 looked at different types of habitat and then created our own triarama showing what plants and animals can be found there.





Science Week - Upper School



Year 4 have been learning how plants grow. We have learnt how water moves in plants. We modelled this by acting it out and then conducted a comparative experiment.





Year 5 have been experimenting to see if waste material is magnetic or conductive as part of our Global Warning topic.





Year 6 have been learning about light and shadow. We have built a periscope to understand reflection. We have also conducted shadow experiments to investigate how the position of the light source affects the size and shape of the resulting shadow.
