

Message from Mrs McGonigle and Mr Fry

This week we proudly marked the <u>Platinum Jubilee</u> at Middleton by engaging in many wonderful and exciting activities. **EYFS children** had a <u>farm animal visit</u> on 24 May as part of their 'Fur and Feathers' topic. <u>Year 6 conducted a lambs heart dissection</u> on 19 May. Year <u>5 & 6 NFL Flag team</u> attended a tournament at Jack Hunt School on 25 May and won the entire competition and progress to the Regional finals in Loughborough-WOW!

We started the Jubilee day by bestowing a golden crown on every single child entering through the gates – the joy on their faces was wonderful. Children and staff made such a huge effort wearing the Jubilee colours and wearing many fabulous outfits, followed by Jubilee-Jam Bagels for breakfast.

We spent the week completing curriculum topics learning about 'Toys and Technology' (retro) from 7 decades of reign (Year 1 and 2) and studying significant 'Platinum people' who were important through the 7 decades (Year 3 and 4) and 'Extraordinary events' from the 7 decades (Year 5 and 6). I was able to observe Year 5 making special news broadcasts using green screen and their iPads; it looked and sounded very professional. Our Whole school 'Jubilee picnic in the park' at Middleton on Thursday 26 May was followed by a whole school 'Jubilee Disco through the decades' on the playground with different music from 7 different decades - the atmosphere was joyous as the golden crowns and children's smiles blinkered in the sunlight!

Year 6 completed their SATs exams and worked very hard for the SATs prep and continue to do so for their Writing element of SATs, which will be assessed in mid-June, they were rewarded with a special Harry Potter morning on Friday 27 May by watching the movie in the Main Hall as a cinema experience with popcorn. This compliments the written work from the Harry Potter book they are studying in Year 6.

We continue to pray for all those families engaged in or threatened

Medication

If your child requires prescribed medication during the school day, you must complete a Medication form.

Injuries (outside of school)

Head Injuries

We have introduced a new system for minor head bumps/ injuries. Instead of calling parents, we are contacting parents/ carers via email when a child has a minor bump to the head. This system occurs successfully in other schools and does not expect parents to 'drop everything' to come into school if our qualified First Aiders have assessed them.



Healthy snacks & water bottles

Children can bring in a healthy snack to have at break time. This MUST NOT be chocolate or nuts – we are a nut free school. Children must bring in a named water bottle.

Covid 19 Information

- As you may be aware, the NHS <u>COVID-19 symptoms in adults</u> and <u>symptoms in children</u> have been updated. Adults and children who have symptoms of a respiratory infection, including COVID-19, should follow the <u>UKHSA guidance</u>.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Testing

- Some individuals may choose to test, either with residual free testing kits or via test kits purchased from pharmacies
- Children and young people with a positive test should stay at home and avoid contact with others for 3
 days. They can return to education after 3 days provided they have no high temperature and feel well
- Adults who test positive should stay at home and avoid contact with others for 5 days. They can return
 to the workplace after 5 days provided they have no high temperature and feel well







In Year 2, we learnt about the History of toys over the past 70 years. We created a toy timeline and spoke about what children in 70 years would like to play with!






