Message from Mrs McGonigle and Mr Fry

Dear Parent/ Carer,

This week we have seen an increase in temperature and hopefully you have some lovely plans over the weekend as a family. On Monday and Tuesday, temperatures are set to increase to mid-to high 30s Please ensure your children and babies and any vulnerable people, particularly those on certain medications are hydrated often, monitored and protected. Children and babies cannot regulate their own body temperature and can deteriorate very quickly if dehydrated. Please use sunscreen, sunhats and loose clothing. On Monday 18 and Tuesday 19 July, children can wear PE uniform, shorts and loose clothing. Please speak with your children about being safe around bodies of water such as rivers and lakes; there is serious risk to life!!

We sent our Year 5 children to the theatre to see Gangsta' Granny this week, and they absolutely loved it; this is a Year group key author and will support their love of reading, their writing and their vocabulary.

You will be aware that Ofsted visited Middleton this week and we were immensely proud of the incredible behaviour of our children – who are 'out of this world', this was despite the searing heat this week. We await a judgement and comments from Ofsted, and this will be quality assured by their HQ and issued over the summer to the Headteacher and then shared with staff, pupils and families, as soon as we are able to. Huge thanks to the continued positive support from our parents and carers.

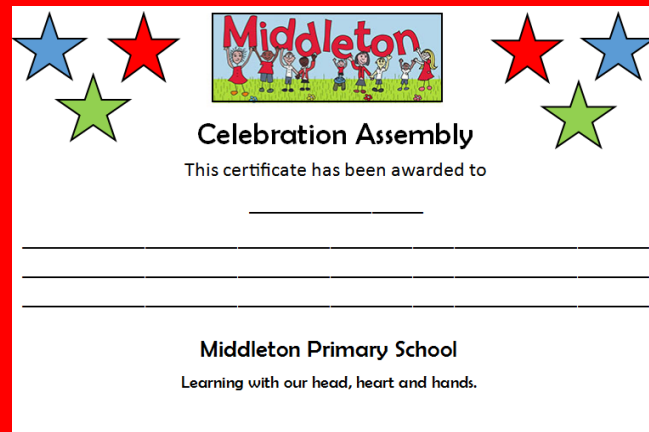
Celebration Assemblies with parents

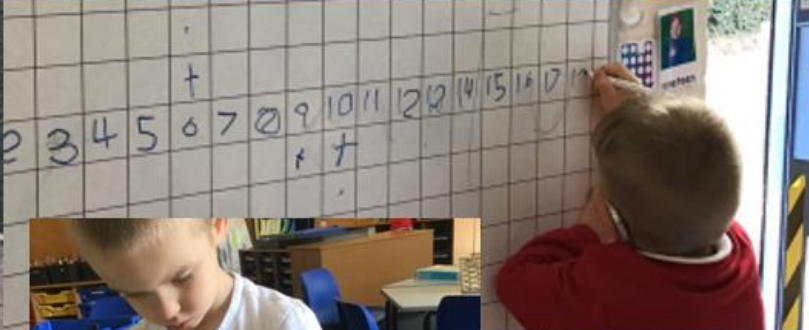

We looked at the police car and all the equipment that the police use.

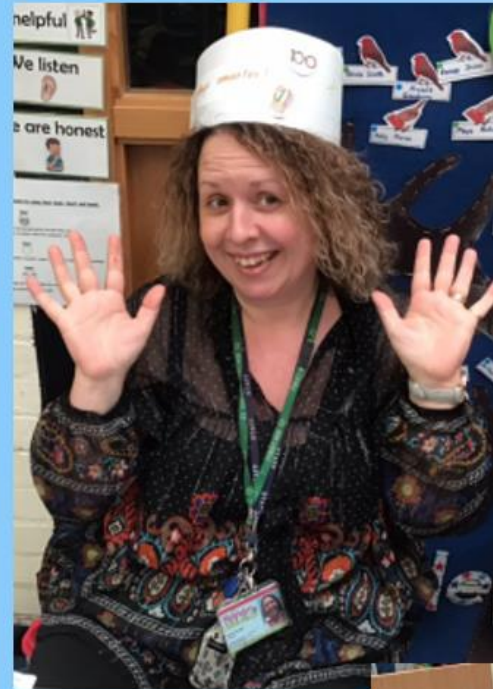


We had great fun celebrating being in school for 100 days.

Farm in a Box experience.

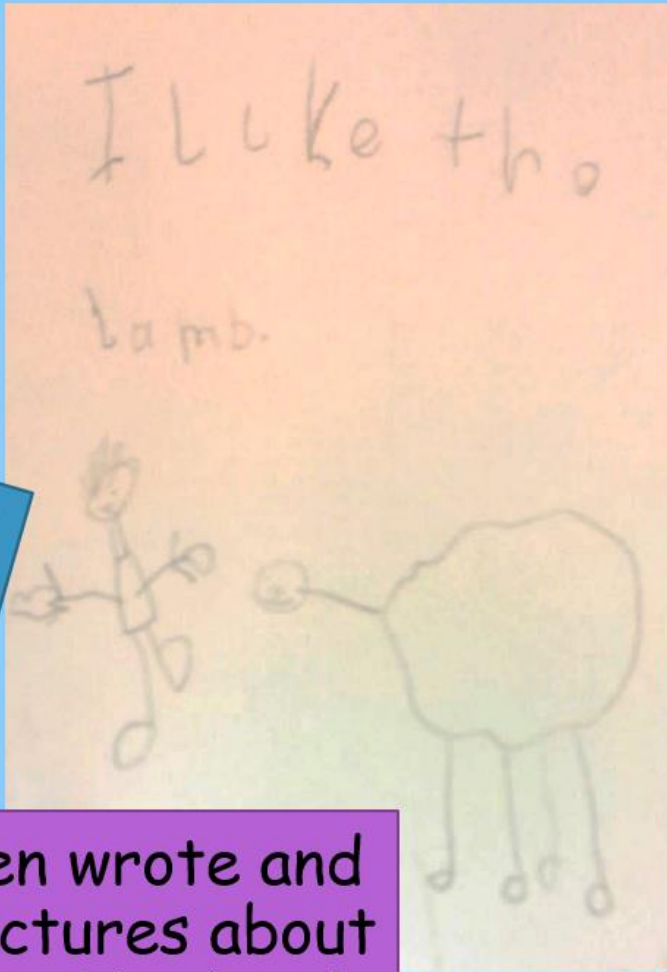
We met Jenny and Farmer George during our virtual trip around the farm.

We then wrote and drew pictures about what we liked and what we learned.

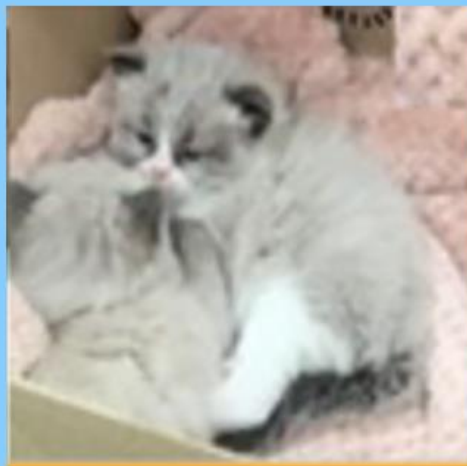
May...

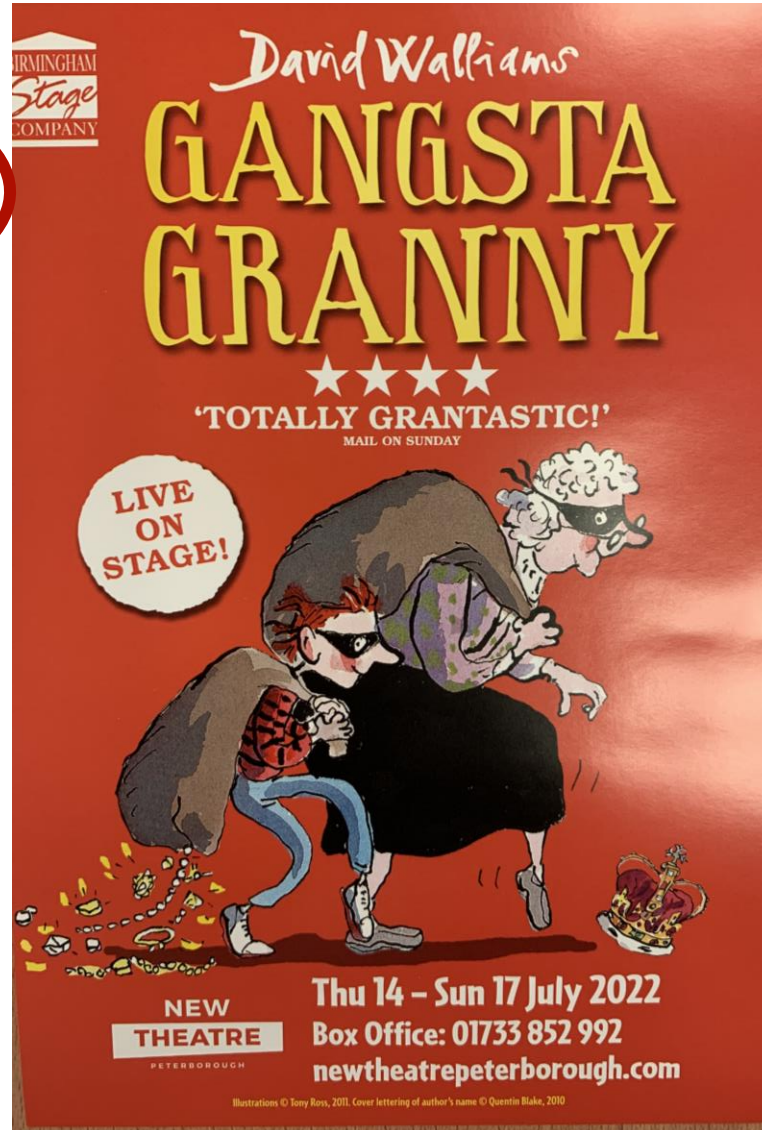

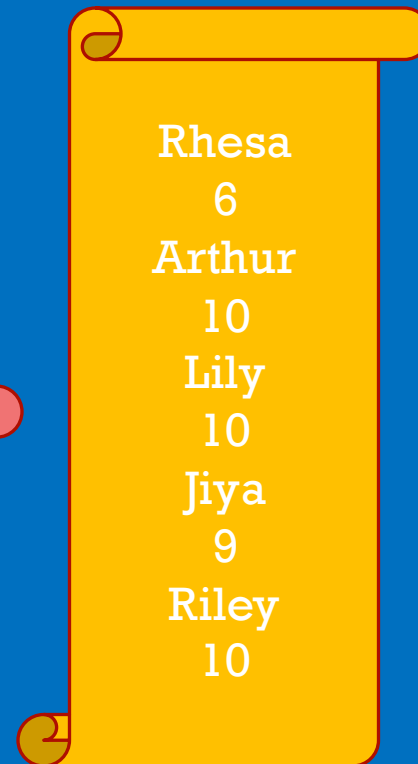
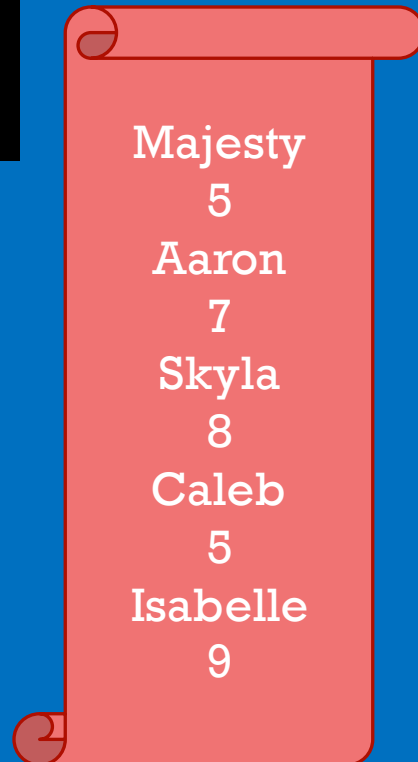
